The Section has worked throughout the past year to be relevant and timely in response to the needs of practicing administrative law lawyers. First, through the dedicated initiative of John Isfeld (Boudreau Law), case digests and commentary have appeared in every issue of *Headnotes & Footnotes* published this year. Secondly, helping Section members make sense of a recent major Supreme Court of Canada decision, the MBA Mid-Winter Conference included a half-day review and discussion of the way in which the practice of administrative law will change, and the panel included a guest speaker from Toronto, a local practitioner, and a law professor. To round out the year, the Section presented a webinar on legal research tactics and resources especially for administrative law lawyers, featuring a nationally-recognized research expert from Alberta.
